## FIGHTING FOR FAIR REPRESENTATION IN SPARTANBURG

Thank you to **SIREN Upstate Action Alliance** and the Local Redistricting Advisory Committee for fighting for fair representation in school district 7 and 5. The deadline for school board candidates to gather petition signatures to be on this year's ballot is July 17.

The groups with the Local Redistricting Advisory Committee are asking lawmakers to approve new maps that would create new single-member districts in Spartanburg School Districts 5 and 7.

Organizers say the current makeup of the nine-member school boards is outdated, leaving some neighborhoods under-represented.

"We believe (the current) multi-member districts create situations where taxpayers are less likely to have a representative on the school board from their own neighborhood," said Marilyn Varner of the West Spartanburg NAACP and Local Redistricting Advisory Committee.

The current configurations of School Districts 5 and 7 were created in the 1990s.

District 5 encompasses Duncan, Lyman, Reidville, Moore, Startex, Wellford and parts of Greer. District 7 encompasses the City of Spartanburg and areas south to Croft State Park, east to Glendale and Converse, and northward from Drayton to Valley Falls.


**School District 5** has one single-member district, one district that elects two members and one that elects six members. Board members are elected to four-year terms. Elections are held every other year (odd-numbered calendar years) with four seats being contested during one election cycle and five being contested during the following cycle.


**School District** 7 has four single-member districts in predominantly Black neighborhoods, and one large, predominantly white, multi-member district that elects five members.

"Candidates are now able to collect signatures without knowing if the names they are collecting will ultimately be in the district in which they are running," Spencer said. "Some candidates may find they end up in another district completely.








## **STATE HOUSE UPDATE**

#### HATE CRIME BILL UPDATE

The House Judiciary Committee gave H.3014 Clementa C. Pinckney Hate Crimes Act a favorable report, and the bill is on the House calendar. South Carolina is only one of two states not to have a hate crimes statute. The bill is named after Clementa C. Pinckney, the former state senator and pastor who died in the massacre at the Emanuel African Methodist Episcopal Church in Charleston in 2015. The bill would allow additional punishments for perpetrators of violent crimes motivated by their perception of someone's race, color, religion, sex, gender, national origin, sexual orientation, or physical or mental disability. The House approved a similar bill two years ago with bipartisan support but the legislation did not move in the Senate. H.3014 has over half the House members as cosponsors. South Carolina's business community threw its weight behind the 2021 effort and is doing so again this year. Industry leaders argue that the lack of a hate crime law could hurt South Carolina's recruitment and retention of businesses.

#### ABORTION BILL UPDATE

#### **Demand Lawmakers Vote NO on Abortion Ban**

Both the SC House and Senate are considering abortion ban bills with limited exceptions. Call the your senator and your representative and tell them to VOTE NO to all abortion bans!

People across the country have made it clear: we support access to abortion. Politicians shouldn't be in control of our lives, we should. It's time that our laws and policies reflect our values.

Take action today to tell your legislators you demand abortion access in South Carolina. VOTE NO on on all abortion bans.

#### **GUN CONTROL**

Republicans in the state legislature have been aggressively pushing to expand access to guns in South Carolina. The most notable bill is the "Constitutional Carry Act", which would allow gun-owners to carry concealed firearms in public without a permit. The bill would prohibit private citizens from carrying concealed firearms onto certain types of properties like courthouses, schools and religious spaces. However, the bill would also lower the age allowed for concealed weapons down to 18 and eliminate the requirement for gun-owners to complete 8 hours of safety training.

The bill (H 3594) recently passed the SC House with the support of Charleston Republican representatives including Kathy Landing, Tom Hartnett, Joe Bustos, Gary Brewer and Matt Leber. The bill is now being debated by the SC Senate.

#### Other Republican Bills Offered by Republicans:

- House Bill H 3393 would require government and financial institutions to conduct business with gun manufacturers, retailers, and gun associations. It is sponsored by Charleston Republican Matt Leber, among other Republicans.
- Senate Bill S 0247 would allow teachers and administrators to carry concealed weapons onto schools.

#### **Gun Control Bills Offered by Democrats:**

- House Bill 3013 would prohibit assault weapons. It is being co-sponsored by Charleston-area Democrats Wendell Gilliard and Marvin Pendarvis, among others.
- House Bill 3055 would require restraining orders and other acts of intimidation or harassment to be reported to SLED in order to prevent the sale of a gun to an unqualified person. It is sponsored by Charleston-area Democrat Leon Stavrinakis, among others.
- Senate Bill 0224 would require gun-owners to buy insurance against the event of a mishap or tragedy with their gun.

#### **EDUCATION CENSORSHIP BILL**

The senate scheduled a subcommittee hearing for H. 3728, radical legislation designed to censor educator speech around historical and contemporary racism and oppression. The hearing will be on March 14th, at 9:30 in the Gressette Building, Room 105.

#### If possible, please consider:

- Providing in person testimony on March 14th. This is most impactful if feasible!
- Meeting with your senator in district.
- Drafting written testimony.




