### Corey Booker Breaks Filibuster Record

25 hours and four minutes! That's how long US Senator Cory Booker spoke truth to power on the Senate floor, sounding the alarm about the "grave and urgent" danger that Trump poses to democracy and the American people. He has now broken the record set by South Carolina's own Strom Thurmond, who spoke for just over 24 hours to try and block the Civil Rights Act of 1957. Now, instead of standing in the way of progress, Senator Booker is standing up for it.

### Federal Grand Jury Convenes to Investigate Spartanburg County Sheriff, Sources Say

According to a recent FITSNews report, a federal grand jury is set to convene in an investigation involving the Spartanburg County Sheriff. While few details have been made public, sources close to the matter suggest that the inquiry may center on allegations of misconduct or mismanagement within the sheriff's office. The U.S. Attorney's Office has not issued any official statement on the proceedings, leaving many Spartanburg residents with questions about the scope and seriousness of the probe.

In the meantime, no charges have been filed, and it remains unclear whether the investigation will ultimately lead to criminal indictments or other disciplinary measures. Observers have noted that federal grand juries often operate under strict confidentiality, meaning specific information about the case may not surface until the process concludes. Local leaders and community members are watching closely, aware that any findings could have significant implications for public trust in law enforcement.

### Senate Republicans' Budget Plans to Add \$5 Trillion to the Budget Over 10 Years

Senate Republicans have passed a budget framework that could add \$5 trillion to the federal deficit over the next decade, largely by extending Trump-era tax cuts and introducing new reductions. Critics warn the plan relies on unrealistic projections and could significantly increase the national debt.

### SC House GOP Passes First-in-the-Nation Trump-Style DEI ban.

That was the message Republicans sent moments after passing H. 3927 on Wednesday, April 2. Democrats fought back during a debate on the House floor that lasted over 8 hours – only to have Republicans put up an amendment that completely rewrote the bill near the very end of the debate. This means that the legislation passed by the House circumvented the basic steps of the legislative process – public testimony, discussion by the Education and Public Works Committee, a study of its fiscal impact – instead receiving just 6 minutes of debate before being voted on. Rep. Hamilton Grant (D-Columbia) told the Post and Courier: "I've seen the fiscal impact on the original bill. I've seen the fiscal impact on the amended bill. This bill? I don't know how much it's going to cost. Nobody knows."

### SC Republicans Want to Raise Your Taxes

Don't let this get lost amidst the debate on diversity, equity, and inclusion. Last week, Republicans unveiled a 'flat tax' scheme that would raise state income taxes on 60% of South Carolinians. Led by Greenville's Rep Bruce Bannister, the flat tax has stalled due to pushback this week, but they are determined to get it passed before the end of session. Let your reps hear from you NOW.

### Family-Planning Up for Debate this Week

### Labor Unions Report Uneven Wage and Job Growth in South Carolina

A recent report commissioned by the AFL-CIO reveals that despite robust employment growth in South Carolina since the COVID-19 pandemic, one in five workers still earn less than \$15 per hour, a figure exceeding both national and regional averages. The study highlights that many of the state's fastest-growing occupations, such as home health aides and warehouse stock movers, offer wages below the state median of \$20.30 per hour. Additionally, the report points to a geographic disparity in job creation, with over 77% of new positions concentrated in Charleston, Greenville, Myrtle Beach, and Columbia, leaving rural areas with fewer opportunities and increased commuting challenges.

### 'Hands Off' Rally in Spartanburg Draws Over 500 Protesters Opposing Trump Policies



# GOP Reps: Shame. On. You.

It is a shameful reflection on the values of their party that Republicans in the SC House of Representatives have chosen to take their marching orders from Donald Trump and exclude anyone who



These four representatives have told their neighbors in Greenville and in South Carolina that if they are not straight, white males they do not matter. By ensuring that workplaces, schools and institutions of higher education are not diverse, equitable, and inclusive, they are proving that they do not care about women, people of color, disabled people, and our LGBTQ+ community. They are told that their very existence means nothing with the passing of this

We live in a state that openly celebrates the "Lost Cause" but that refuses to recognize the history of the Suffrage movement, the Civil Rights movement, and so many other movements that demanded justice and equal rights for all.

Reps. Bannister, Huff, Vaughan, and Wickensimer support this bill because they believe that their demographic is being "illegally discriminated against". The logic is laughable at best and downright shameful at worst.

Rep. Chandra Dillard proclaimed on the floor of the House that "colleges and universities are a microcosm of America which is diversity, equity, and inclusion, what we do matters! We have sent young people into a mental health spiral. They see it as an attack on their very opportunities,

their future, and what they will be able to do as they matriculate through higher education." This hateful bill will reduce opportunities for students and make them rethink coming to South Carolina to further their studies. Shame on our representatives.

Rep. Wendell Jones' amendments showed how the bill violated the Constitution by denying freedom of speech and academic freedom, the equal protection clause of 14th amendment, and a clause in the Constitution that says that we cannot go back and retroactively cancel contracts that are made in good faith. The bill aims to penalize businesses that have DEI programs and tell them that they cannot do business in the state if they decide to keep these programs. Businesses will now rethink moving to South Carolina which will cause a loss of job creation because of this hateful bill. Shame on our representatives.

In a video update, Representative Jones mused that "our leadership is allowing Washington to dictate everything we do and have abdicated their responsibility to lead. Our leadership is allowing Washington to dictate EVERYTHING they do and it does not match our state." I agree, Rep. Jones. GOP Representatives Bannister, Huff, Vaughan, and Wickensimer have abdicated their responsibility to their neighbors in Greenville by allowing Donald Trump to dictate everything they do. Shame on Rep. Bruce Bannister. Shame on Rep. Chris Huff. Shame on Rep. David Vaughan. Shame on Rep. Paul Wickensimer.


