

Spartanburg County School DistrictRedistricting Information: School Districts 5 and 7

- Redistricting, or redrawing the boundaries of the area an elected official represents, happens every 10 years after the Census.
- In South Carolina, while cities handle city redistricting and counties handle county redistricting, the state Legislature is the authority over school district redistricting.
- School Districts 5 and 7 both have a combination of single-member and multi-member districts. In a single-member district, one person is elected from each district; in a multi-member district, a group of candidates are all elected from the same area.
- We believe multi-member districts create situations where taxpayers are less likely to have a representative on the school board from their own neighborhood.
- The West Spartanburg NAACP and the Local Redistricting Advisory Committee (LRAC) have produced several possible maps for the District 5 redistricting process.
- SIREN and the Local Redistricting Advisory Committee have produced several possible maps for the District 7 process.
- This month, state Senate staff unveiled their own possible maps for Districts 5 and 7, including a singlemember map for both school districts.
- The redistricting coalition *fully supports* the state's proposed single-member plans, and we are asking you to lend your support to them as well.

SCHOOL BOARD CANDIDATE PROCESS

- √ All school board seats are non-partisan.
- ✓ Candidates must collect signatures on a petition before July 17, 2023, to appear on a ballot.
- ✓ In Districts 1, 2, 3, 4, AND 6, candidates need 120 signatures of registered voters in a district.
- ✓ In the current Districts 5-1-, 5-2, 5-3, 7-1, 7-4 and 7-5, candidates need 75 signatures.
- ✓ Petitions are filed with the Spartanburg County Board of Elections.

HOW YOU CAN GET INVOLVED


